Specification for the Appointment of a Service Provider to Translate the Department's English PAIA Manual into isiXhosa and Afrikaans

1. BACKGROUND

The Department is mandated in terms of the Constitution and the Promotion of Access to Information Act No. 2 of 2000 to publish a PAIA manual. The Manual provides guidance for the public to access information held by the Eastern Cape Department of Social Development (ECDSD). It outlines procedures for requesting information, including who to contact and what records are available. The Manual aims to promote transparency and accountability within ECDSD. The manual must be published and accessible in English, isiXhosa, and Afrikaans, the three most widely spoken languages in the Eastern Cape. The manual is currently only available in English.

2. SCOPE OF WORK:

- 2.1 The successful bidder will be responsible for translation of the Department's current English PAIA manual consisting of 22 pages into both isiXhosa and Afrikaans.
- 2.2 Once the translation services are completed, the bidder must provide a certificate confirming the accuracy and correctness of the translation.
- 2.3 The completed translated manuals in isiXhosa and Afrikaans must be saved in Microsoft Word and submitted to the Department electronically. The translated manuals will always remain the property of the Department.

3. COMPETENCIES AND EXPERTISE REQUIRED

A bidder must have a proven track record in providing translation services. To confirm this, the bidder must submit two (2) reference letters detailing the scope of translation work performed in the public sector, in support of Annexure B herein.

4, PENALTIES

The Department reserves the right to impose penalties on the successful bidder in the event of non-compliance with the stipulated turnaround time. These penalties will be in accordance with the General Conditions of Contract.





5. CONTRACT/DELIVERY PERIOD

The contract duration will be two months or until the completion of translation services, whichever occurs first. The commencement date will be mutually agreed upon with the successful bidder. The successful bidder will be required to sign a Service Level Agreement with the Department.

6. LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

To support Local Economic Development within the Province, bidders are encouraged to prioritize employment and subcontracting opportunities for people and suppliers based in the Eastern Cape Province, where possible.

7. PRICING

- 7.1 Bidders must submit a detailed price schedule in respect of all costs and quote as per the pricing schedule attached hereto.
- 7.2 Prices must be inclusive of VAT. If not confirmed, the Department will assume that the price quoted is inclusive of VAT. The Department does not pay VAT to service providers that are not registered with SARS as VAT vendors. It is compulsory for bidders with taxable supplies exceeding R1,000,000.00 (excluding VAT) in a 12 month period to register for VAT.
- 7.3 Bidders must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as department will not rectify any errors on the quotations received. The quotes should include all activities/services that will be required for the required services as no variations will be accepted unless mutually agreed to by department and the appointed service provider prior to contract acceptance.
- 7.4 Bidders will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposal submitted have been signed by a duly authorized person. Should it be established after the submission of proposal that the signatory authorizing the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.
- 7.5 All prices submitted should be typed or hand written in black ink. No proposals written in pencil will be accepted or evaluated.



8. PAYMENTS

- 8.1 The successful bidder will bill the Department with an invoice after the translation services have been completed.
- 8.2 The invoice must be accompanied by a certificate confirming the correctness and accuracy of the translation.
- 8.3 Payment will be made within 30 days of submission of a properly completed invoice.

9. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 9.1 In conducting the verification, the service provider should at all times ensure strict compliance with all relevant legislation.
- 9.2 Bidders must be registered in the Central Supplier Database (CSD). If not registered, bidders must ensure that they are registered before submission of their quotations. Supplier registration may be performed online at the National Treasury's website, www.treasury.gov.za. The Department will not award a contract to a bidder that is not registered on the CSD.

10. EVALUATION

The quotation will be evaluated in two phases, pre-evaluation and evaluation as per Preferential Procurement Framework Act 5 of 2000 (PPPFA) as indicated below:

10.1 PRE-EVALUATION CRITERIA

The following are pre-qualification criteria:

- 10.1.1 Quotation is only valid when signed by the service provider.
- 10.1.2 Correction fluid of any kind MUST NOT be used. In cases where corrections are necessary; these can be made by drawing a line across the incorrect statement, writing in the correct details above the same and subsequently endorsing the entry with the bidder's signature.

- 10.1.5 Provide minimum of two contactable references on similar work previously done. (Complete Annexure B and submit reference letter/s confirming two translation projects in the public sector)

N.B: Failure to fully comply with the pre-qualification criteria to the satisfaction of the department may lead to the automatic disqualification of Quotation. In-Loco inspection may be conducted by the Department on shortlisted Service Providers before the award.

Bid proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the 80/20-preference point system, as contemplated in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act 5 of 2000). Bids will be evaluated on price and specific goals.
