# SPECIFICATION FOR PURCHASING OF SECURITY ID CARD SYSTEM WITH RELATED EQUIPMENT AND CONSUMABLES

#### 1. BACKGROUND

The Department is employing Four Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty-Eight (4238) personnel across the province of the Eastern Cape. As part of compliance with the Control of Access to Public Premises and Vehicle's Act, Act 53 of 1985, officials are required to identify themselves before access to premises are considered. Further requirement from the mentioned legislation is that authority be granted for the official seeking access prior access can be granted. In order to enable compliance with these requirements of the legislation the Department seek to implement an ID Card system which will be unique to the Department to allow officials to be able to identify themselves as employees of the Department. The Department is therefore seeking to procure an identification card system with all its relevant equipment and consumables to enable the design, printing and issuing of id cards to employees.

# 2. SCOPE OF WORK:

#### 3. PRICING

- 3.1 Bidders must submit a detailed price schedule in respect of all costs and quote as per the pricing schedule attached hereto.
- 3.2 Prices must be inclusive of VAT. If not confirmed, the Department will assume that the price quoted is inclusive of VAT. The Department does not pay VAT to service providers that are not registered with SARS as VAT vendors. It is compulsory for bidders with taxable supplies exceeding R1,000,000.00 (excluding VAT) in a 12 month period to register for VAT.
- 3.3 Bidders must ensure that the quotes submitted have no arithmetic errors as department will not rectify any errors on the quotations received. The quotes should include all activities/services that will be required for the required services as no variations will be accepted unless mutually agreed to by department and the appointed service provider prior to contract acceptance.
- 3.4 Bidders will carry the responsibility of ensuring that the proposal submitted have been signed by a dully authorized person. Should it be established after the submission of proposal that the signatory authorizing the proposal is not legally appointed by the service provider, the offer/proposal will be disqualified from the evaluation process.



3.5 All prices submitted should be typed or hand written in black ink. No proposals written in pencil will be accepted or evaluated.

#### 4. DELIVERY PERIOD & ADDRESS

4.1. The items must be delivered at Albertina Sisulu House, 7 Beatrice Street, Qonce, Room 34 within two weeks after the receipt of an official order.

#### 5. PAYMENT

- 5.1. The successful bidder will bill the Department after services have been rendered successfully.
- 5.2. Payment will be made within 30 days of submission of a properly competed invoice and delivery note.

#### 6. SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

- 6.1 Preference will be given to service providers based in the Eastern Cape Province who can deliver the product, subject to compliance with the SCM regulatory framework. Proof thereof will be required.
- 6.2 Bidders must be registered in the Central Supplier Database (CSD). If not registered, bidders must ensure that they are registered before submission of their quotations. Supplier registration may be performed online at the National Treasury's website, www.treasury.gov.za. The Department will not award a contract to a bidder that is not registered on the CSD.

- 9.4 A contract may, on reasonable and justifiable grounds, be awarded to a bidder that did not score the highest number of points.
- 9.5 The Department will not award a contract to a bidder whose TAX affairs are not in order.
- 9.6 No bids will be considered if submitted after the closing time.
- 9.7 This bid is subject to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2000 and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022, the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and, if applicable, any other legislation or special conditions of contract.
- 9.8 The Department reserves the right to require that both the contracting firm and its personnel providing the service be cleared by the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining a positive recommendation is the responsibility of the contracting firm concerned. If the principal contractor appoints a subcontractor, the same provisions and measures will apply to the subcontractor. Acceptance of the tender is also subject to the condition that the contractor will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require (full completion and submission of company questionnaire post award annexure C).
