CARE AND SUPPORT SERVICES TO FAMILIES 2025/2028 FINANCIAL YEAR (3 YEARS)

1. INTRODUCTION

The mandate of the Sub-programme is provision of developmental Social Welfare Services through care and support services to families. The programme provides a range of services in a holistic approach targeting families. The niche is to strengthen and empower families so that they can support individual members of the families. Programmes / Services to families are provided through programmes such as Family Preservation, Family Resource Centre, Single Parents, Fatherhood and Parenting Skills Programmes.

2. STRATEGY FOR INTERVENTION

The strategy for intervention is to offer services in line with the four (4) levels of intervention as stipulated in integrated services delivery model that is prevention, early intervention, statutory and continuum of care / after care services. The focus is on the three Strategic areas and envisaged actions of the White Paper for Families (June 2013) which are outlined below:

- Strategic Priority: 1 Promotion of Healthy Family Life
- Strategic priority: 2 Family Strengthening
- Strategic Priority: 3 Family Preservation

Emphasis is on prevention and early intervention levels and Family preservation services should be implemented at all levels.

3. OBJECTIVES OF 2025/2028 FUNDING

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The programme seeks to achieve its mandate through funding of Non-Government Organizations (FAMSAS) and Non- Profit Organizations that implement Family Preservation, Family Resource Centres, Single Parents Association and Fatherhood Programmes. The Programmes rendered in Families are described as follows:

FAMILY PRESEVATION PROGRAMMES (FPP)

 Family Preservation Programmes are responsible for Empowerment of families through Life Skills, Youth Mentorship, Family Group Conferencing, Community Conferencing, Intensive Family Support, Educational Awareness, Teenage Parents, Marriage Preparation and Enrichment Programmes.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE PROGRAMMES AND YOUTH CARE CENTRES (FRC)

 Family Resource Centres are responsible for Provision of After School Care, Skills Development, Family Enrichment, Income Generation for families, Intergenerational and Integrated Holiday Programmes for families (as stipulated in the Framework for Holiday Programmes).

SINGLE PARENTS ASSOCIATION PROGRAMMES (SPA)

• Single Parents Association are responsible for Empowerment, Support, Skills Development, Economic Empowerment and Income generation programmes for Single Parents.

FATHERHOOD PROGRAMMES

- Fatherhood Programmes are responsible for Empowerment of Fathers to play their role as fathers, Provision of Parenting Skills & Programmes, Men Care +, Prevention and Educational Campaigns to address the issue of absent fathers (as stipulated in Fatherhood Strategy) must include the following campaigns/programmes/services (but not limited):
